Hey Folks!

This has been another hot summer in Sacramento. If you are a thermophile, you are enjoying yourself! Thermophiles are heat loving bacteria that can thrive in temperatures as high as 175 degrees Fahrenheit. The rest of us are trying to find ways to stay cool while trying to remain active.

Last weekend had unusually cool temperatures on Saturday and Sunday. Joanne and I took advantage of the break in the heat and spent the night out on the hook in New York Cove. We got a late start; we probably didn't get the sails raised till about 3 pm or so on Saturday, but we had a nice downwind sail to the Cove. We didn't see any sailboats out, but there were some small dinghies that were being towed back to the Marina. There was probably a race earlier in the day. Once we arrived at the Cove, there were a lot of power boats at anchor enjoying the last of the sunshine. We dropped the hook, poured ourselves a glass of wine, and went for a swim. We grilled some tube steaks on the BBQ and ate a caprese salad from the garden for dinner. By 8 pm, we had the Cove all to ourselves. It was cool that night. We were both glad that we had our sleeping bags.

We are looking forward to getting out a couple more times before we need to pull our boats from the slips for the year. It is looking like we will be out of the water by August 18 this year. That is a total bummer! In fact, at its highest level, there were only five stair-steps from the parking lot down to the dock. Last weekend, it was 49 stair-steps from the parking lot down to the dock. Even though we had a good snow year, Folsom Lake is dropping fast. This is mostly due to power demands and water quality issues (mainly salinity levels) in the Delta. California experiences a drought every year. It's called summer.

I hate to be the bearer of bad news, but for all of you who have slips or dry storage at Folsom Lake, it looks like boating season is coming to an abrupt and premature end. I've been watching the CDEC website: the Bureau of Reclamation has been releasing 5,000 to 5,500cfs nearly continuously every day since mid-June. Those of you who were at the Bigs and Littles event on June 22nd may recall that it was only 8 steps down from the parking lot to "A" dock. Yesterday, only 5 weeks later, it was 51 steps, and the lake has been falling 1.5 to 2 feet every day for the last 5 weeks.

I have just this morning received an email from Marina manager Julie Christensen, that Bureau of Reclamation projects pond elevation to fall to 412' by August 18th. This is the minimum level for boats to get in and out of the marina slips, and 412' triggers mandatory boat haul-out. In her email, Julie says that BuRec has been forced into this rapid draw-down of Folsom Lake, due to bad water quality in the Delta, the result of the nearly monthlong heat wave that has baked the entire Central Valley for most of July. August 18th is the third Sunday of the month, and Julie has set that date as mandatory haul-out, but cautions all slip renters that the lake could fall faster than BuRec's projection, and reach 412' before the 18th. All slip renters will be responsible to monitor the CDEC website at: http://cdec.water.ca.gov/dynamicapp/QueryF?s=fol and be ready to haul out as soon as the lake reaches 412'.

Slip renters may start hauling boats to their drystorage spaces as of July 30th. Looking at the CDEC website as I write this on July 30th, the lake has fallen 1/2 foot in just the last 10 hours, so I would not count on that we will even make it to August 18th.

This is a bitter disappointment, considering that we had a wet winter with 120% of normal snowpack, and every expectation of having a "full season" until December 1st. As I write this, Folsom Lake's pond elevation is 433', a full 20 feet below the 453-foot pond elevation it had a year ago on July 30th, 2023.

So, keep an eye on your email for any further messages from the Marina manager (Julie), and make sure your tow vehicle and trailer are ready for haul-out; it looks like we only have 2 weeks left.

I was intending to stay over Saturday night, but could not locate the raft-up, which was supposed to be in South Fork. But I went all the way to the Salmon Falls Bridge and never found it. Attempts to raise the Prestons by VHF or cell phone also failed. The only other place they could have been was somewhere up in North Fork, but by the time I got to the Salmon Falls Bridge, it was after 7:30pm, and too late in the day to head north. The entire week of Fourth of July was hammered by the first heat wave of the summer; I tried to spend Saturday night, July 6th, on my boat, but it was still 90°F at 21:00, way too hot for comfort, so I bailed and went home.

The next cruise is the Shooting Star/Hot August Nights event, August 10th-11th at Union Valley Reservoir. If anyone would like to lead this cruise, please let me know.

The Labor Day Cruise, Aug. 30-Sept. 1, will be held at either Brannan Island State Park, or Antioch Marina. A cruise leader is needed for this event also. The hoped-for Halloween Cruise is now cancelled, as Folsom Lake Marina will almost certainly be closed at least 8 weeks before Halloween.

Between travel, remodeling the kitchen, health issues and the heat in the last 2 months, finding time to go sailing is scarce. I have been on the boat 1 day racing the Cam Cup and 1 day launching then retrieving the boat for the Bigs and Littles. Therefore, all I can produce is some local race results.

First off, like last year the FLYC Centerboard Regatta was not held on the scheduled day as the weather (108 deg F) was prohibitive. Imagine going downwind when there is reduced windage across the boat in 108 deg. weather. Unlike last year, when it was even warmer, and the race cancelled, this year it was rescheduled 1 week later. 4 boats tested it in milder temps and a decent breeze. This event is usually from the entrance of the south fork up to Salmon Falls bridge - lunch race back to the wind line on the south fork.

Results:

1st - Kerry Johnson 2nd - Rob Cram 3rd - Sagar Upadhyay 4th - Preston Bakken All 4 were on Banshee's.

Last Saturday was the best opportunity for the C22 sailors to compete in the Single-Handed Regatta where there is 1 person doing all the work. The race is for any boat normally crewed by 2 or more and scoring is on the handicap system, so all times are corrected. Imagine flying a spinnaker on a 24-foot boat SOLO. It was an around-the-buoys type race so control of the sails was at a premium.
