The main purpose of the *Cisne Branco* is to develop and promote Brazilian naval traditions. It will take part in important nautical events, representing the Brazilian Navy, in Brazil and abroad, like in Baltimore. How cool!

► BIGS AND LITTLES SAIL DAY < JUNE 22, 2024

The Big day is almost here and preparations are almost finished. Currently we have 10 boats participating, representing Catalina 22 Fleet 4 (Folsom) and Fleet 54 (Grass Valley) and Folsom Lake Yacht Club. It is not too late to sign up; any skipper who can take 1 or 2 pairs of Bigs/Littles for a ride is appreciated.

Itinerary for the day, Saturday 6/22:

- 9:30AM Boats all set up and ready to go. Skippers gather at the hilltop picnic area.
- 9:30 10:00AM Assignments made to match Bigs/Littles with skippers.
- 9:30 10:00AM Head out onto the water for sailing, swimming, splashing.
- 11:45 12:00 noon Hamburger/hot dog picnic.
- 1:00PM Group photo under the club banners.

A reminder of what this event entails: This has been a favorite event for about 20 years. Originally organized by Catalina 22 Fleet 4, this event is now co-sponsored by Fleet 4 and FLYC. We take the Big/Little pairs out for about 2-3 hours of sailing in the morning, followed by a BBQ lunch at the hilltop picnic area. At the end of lunch, we gather for a group photo. While on the lake, the pairs often like to jump in the water and have water fights with their friends on other boats. Many of the kids have never been in a sailboat or even in the water. They always have a lot of fun and come back proud of their accomplishments. The club skippers and crew also have a good time.

Volunteers are needed for:

- Being a skipper and taking out 1 or 2 pairs for a ride on your boat.
- Skippers who don't have crew often appreciate having someone volunteer to be their crew to help with boat handling and keeping kids happy.

Summer weather is just around the corner, and Folsom Lake is about as full as it ever gets: last weekend when I was there, it was 7 steps from the parking lot down to "A" dock. I've seen the lake get high enough (466' pond elevation) to make these 4 steps, but in recent years, Bureau of Reclamation seems to have decided to limit pond elevation to about 463'. It's really nice to drive into the marina and see the boats "right there", floating practically at the same level as the parking lot. Carrying a picnic cooler, and whatever other stuff you've brought for a day out on the water, is sure easier when it's only 7 steps down to the dock instead of 50 or more, as it will be at the end of the season.

Memorial Weekend Cruise Report

The Memorial Weekend Cruise had really wonderful weather: not too hot in the daytime, not too cold at night. Saturday was unusually cloudy in the morning hours, resulting in the lowest occupancy of cars in the parking lot at Brown's Ravine that I've ever seen for a summer holiday weekend: maybe 20%. I found a bird nest in my sail cover, having forgotten to tie off the aft end, so between that and the usual accumulation of bird droppings, there was a bit of a mess to clean up, but this is inevitable and part of the "experience" of keeping a boat at Folsom Lake Marina. I spent a couple of hours cleaning, then at 14:00, slipped my dock lines for a day sail and cruise around the corner to New York Cove. The wind was dying off, and I only got to sail for about 45 minutes, but it was so sweet to feel the boat heel over to the breeze, and get the sails trimmed to where the helm was balanced.

In the late afternoon, the morning cloudiness had burned off, and there were a few powerboats out, but once I got into South Fork, there was hardly any boat traffic, and in New York Cove I had the place

all to myself. I found a place in the shade to anchor, then took out a book and read for a while. By 19:00, the wind had died completely, so I motored back to the Marina, slowly, to enjoy the ride and just relax. I only saw a couple of other boats the whole hour it took for the transit. Gary and Karen Preston arrived at the Marina a little after sunset, to spend Saturday night on Charmed Life, and it was so quiet, with no wind to rattle halyards or shake my jib sock, that I could hear music coming from one of the houses on the hillside. I love spending a night on the boat in spring or autumn, when it cools down after sunset. I ate my dinner and read a little more in my book, and had a sound sleep, finally waking up when the sun rose high enough to come through the cabin windows and wake me. Being retired and not having to jump out of bed at 5:00am is sure a fine thing, especially when you can come out to the lake to spend time on your boat as often as you like, and on whatever day of the week suits you.

Sunday's weather was totally clear, no clouds anywhere, and it was maybe 10° warmer than Saturday had been. At 10:00am, the launch ramp was bustling, with the crowd you would expect for a summer holiday weekend. At noon, Gary and Karen took off in *Charmed Life*, Gary mentioning to me that they were going to South Fork. I left a couple of hours later at 14:00, also headed to South Fork. I made it all the way to the Salmon Falls Road Bridge, looking for them in Deep Ravine, Hancock Creek Cove, New York Cove, Sweetwater Cove, and Indian Springs Cove, but there was no sign of them, and I couldn't raise them on VHF. I assume they headed for North Fork and were out of VHF range by the time I tried to call them on the radio. By the time I got to the Salmon Falls Bridge, it was 19:00, so I headed back to the Marina. arriving just before sunset, with just enough daylight left to get both of the sail covers on, and get the boat buttoned up to go home before the gate was locked.

What's Coming Up

Big Brothers/Big Sisters Cruise
June 22-23

The next Fleet 4 cruise event is the Big Brothers/Big Sisters Sail Day and Picnic on June 22. If you have not already signed up, and you

would like to participate, please contact Karen Preston. The more boats we have in the event, the more guests we can take out, and the more fun it will be! If you have a 22-foot boat, we can place 1 pair (1 Big + 1 Little), and if you have a 25~26-foot boat, 2 pairs can go. We generally go sailing for about 60 minutes, from 09:30 to 10:30, then there's a swim party from 10:30 to noon. The swim party generally takes place close to the marina entrance, so it's a 10-15-minute ride back to the docks for the picnic. The picnic, always handled marvelously by Madeline Rayfuse and her shore crew, will feature cheeseburgers, chips, fresh fruit, soda, and cookies for dessert. Delicious! NOTE: If you plan to be at the picnic, I suggest you bring a folding chair to sit in, unless you really like hard wooden picnic table benches. At the conclusion of the Picnic, please don't immediately run off, as I will be doing the Group Photo, a long-running tradition at the Bigs and Littles picnic.

Following the Picnic, anyone wishing to spend Saturday night on their boat, please let me know, as this weekend is also a Fleet 4 Cruise. Participation in the Bigs and Littles Day Sail will get you 4 cruise points; if you spend the night on your boat, that gives you 6 additional points, making it 10 points for a 1-night Folsom Lake cruise.

San Juan and Gulf Islands Cruise July, TBD

If anyone is interested in heading north to Bellingham, Washington, July is usually the best month for a cruise in the San Juan and Gulf Islands. I've done 5 trips up there, four times with Catalina 25's (twice with *Quiet Time* #1205, and twice with Quiet Time #5857), and once with a Catalina 22 There are two options for launching: (Magic). Ramp launching at Squalicum Marina Bellingham, or using a travel lift in Anacortes; this option keeps your trailer out of salt water, but it's much more expensive. In 2010, that travel lift launch cost \$150; I'd guess it's probably twice that much now. I've always launched at the ramp in Bellingham, and there is a fresh water washdown station on the east side of the parking lot to rinse your trailer and outboard. There is a huge Fred Myer store in Bellingham for provisioning, and we generally spend the first night in the Marina, then head out the next morning. The arrival date and itinerary will usually be set up to have the group arrive at Sidney Marina on a Wednesday afternoon, so that we have all day Thursday to explore the Sidney Street Fare and Market, then all day Friday to visit either Victoria or Butchart Garden; there is a municipal bus system on Vancouver Island that you can ride to either place to and from the Marina. Please contact me if you would like to either lead or join a Fleet 4 Cruise to the San Juans this summer. The last one was in 2010, so maybe it's time to do this!

<u>Delta Dawdle Cruise</u> July 4-7

The July 4th weekend will feature the Delta Dawdle Cruise. There are two ways to do this:

- 1. Launch at Brannan Island State Park and cruise south through 3 Mile Slough to the San Joaquin River, then west to Antioch, spending the night there. Then sail east along the Delta and north back up the Sacramento River, returning to Brannan Island.
- 2. Launch at Antioch, and do day sails around Sherman Island and Suisun Bay. You can overnight at Antioch Marina, or anchor out somewhere, but don't forget the tides; make sure your anchorage is in deep enough water that you won't be aground in the mud at low tide. If you leave early enough in the morning for a day sail, you can head up to Brannan Island, and return to Antioch through 3 Mile Slough and the San Joaquin River. Just be cognizant that in mid-summer, wind in the Delta can be 30 mph. If your only headsail is a 130 Genoa, and you don't have roller furling, that's going to be a problem as a 130 is way too much sail on a windy summer day in the Delta.

The Big Event for the Delta is the Fourth of July Hilton Fireworks Extravaganza at Mandeville Tip County Park on the San Joaquin River. If you have a chart of the area, look for Light #3 (green) on the Stockton Deep Water Channel. The barge that the fireworks are shot from is anchored nearby. If you launch at Brannan Island, it is 12 nm, via 3 Mile Slough and the San Joaquin River, from the launch ramp to Light #3 at Mandeville Tip.

Shooting Star Cruise August 10-11

August is the month for the Shooting Star Cruise to Union Valley Reservoir. The Recreation.gov

website currently has an Alert that the Sunset boat launch is closed until 7/3/2024 for construction and repairs, but this should not affect a cruise in August. Union Valley Reservoir is beautiful in mid-summer, high enough in elevation (4,800 feet) to be out of the sweltering heat of the Valley, and with an afternoon wind pattern that makes for some exciting sailing conditions most days.

<u>Labor Day Weekend Cruise</u> August 31 - September 2

Labor Day Weekend in September will probably be the last official Fleet 4 Cruise for the year, unless Folsom Lake still has enough water for the Marina to still be in operation the weekend of October 26-27 for a Halloween Cruise. The Labor Day Weekend Cruise location is open. I will probably be out at Folsom Lake, but if someone wants to lead an "away" cruise to somewhere else, just let me know. Meanwhile, have a great summer wherever you are - hopefully on your boat, or at least somewhere else that you are having fun.

In closing, please allow me to make a final "push" here to encourage you to get signed up with Karen Preston for the Bigs and Littles Sail Day on June 22nd.

Blast From the Past

And now, we briefly revisit a "blast from the past". Thirty-one years ago this month, for the Memorial Weekend 1993 Fleet 4 Cruise, I was cruise leader for a Delta Ditch Run, on my MacGregor 25 *Lynn Marie*. 18 Fleet 4 boats assembled at Richmond Marina Bay, and sailed all the way to Rio Vista, then to Brannan Island to haul out. Mike Nielsen was our carpool driver, for this was a cruise where the tow vehicles and trailers had to be moved from Richmond to Brannan Island, then the skippers driving them had to be ferried back in a 15-passenger van to Richmond. These were the glory days of Fleet 4, and I reproduce here the participant roster from the after-event article I wrote for the 4-um on June 13th, 1993:
